TAPEIT will select one Property Technician as the Property and Evidence Technician of the year. The selected nominee will be recognized at the annual conference.


Hello everyone,

Billy Rowles Retired DPS Trooper Sheriff - Jasper County, TX (1996 - 2004) Texas Ranger

Ranger Rowles grew up in Beaumont, Texas. Upon graduation from high school Rowles enlisted in the US Marines and serve four years including two tours in Vietnam.

Ranger Rowles has attended Sam Houston University, SWT State University and, Central Texas Jr. College.

Ranger Rowles law enforcement career started with the Texas DPS where he first served as security for the then Governor Preston Smith. Ranger Rowles then went back to east Texas as a Trooper and remained in that position for the remainder of his 27 years with the State. He was given a special Texas Ranger commission which he still holds.

He was sworn in as the Jasper county Sheriff January 1997 and remained in that position through 2004. Less than 2 years after becoming sheriff his agency, and his community, dealt with the brutal murder of James Byrd.

He has spoken to many law enforcement organizations all over our country and believes that there is no greater honor than to get asked to share his story to so many brothers and sisters who wear the badge of courage.

No, I Don't Think We Want To Get Rid of That Just Yet...

This is just one example of why evidence containing potential biological material is being maintained for so long and why we (or our State crime labs for Texas counties with a population of less than 100,000) will be keeping some evidence for longer periods of time than we ever have:

Nineteen-year-old Mary Sullivan had just moved from Cape Cod to Boston. Within a few days of her arrival in January 1964, she was found dead. Her attacker raped her and strangled her to death.

Sullivan was one of 11 women whom Albert DeSalvo — known as the Boston Strangler — would later confess to killing. However, he then recanted, leaving lingering doubts about the possibility that the real assailant had eluded capture.

Evidence that finally linked DeSalvo to the Sullivan assault emerged in July 2013.

Over the years, NIJ has funded the examination of "cold cases" across the country through its Solving Cold Cases with DNA program. The funding helps police departments identify, review, investigate and analyze violent crime cold cases that could be solved through DNA analysis. Sometimes the cases are so old that DNA testing did not yet exist when the crimes were committed, and testing biological evidence now might show a match with a suspect.

In 2009 and 2012, the city of Boston received competitive grants under NIJ's cold case program. The Boston Police Department's cold case squad decided to use some of the NIJ funding to test DNA from a nephew of DeSalvo's and look for a match with seminal fluid that had been found on Sullivan's body and on a blanket at the crime scene. When forensics experts ran the test, they got a hit.
