



Jocelyn Brown is a Professor of Pediatrics at Columbia University, College of Physicians & Surgeons and the Director of the Hospital and the borough-based Child Advocacy Centers in Manhattan, in New York City. She is board certified in Pediatrics and Child Abuse Pediatrics. For the past thirty years, her clinical experience has focused on the medical diagnosis of child abuse, the coordination of a multidisciplinary response to the investigation, the prosecution of child abuse cases and the delivery of mental health services for abused children.

She is a Principal Investigator on a training grant from the Midwest Regional Children's Advocacy Center. National Children's Alliance n.e.t Videoconference Program that provides peer review training to health professionals in medical evaluation of child abuse.

She is a Vice Chair of the New York City Citizen Review Panel (CRP). By law CRP are authorized to examine policies, procedures, and practices of Child Welfare Services and advocate for legislation in NYS.

Dr. Brown received a Master in Narrative Medicine from Columbia University in 2023. She is the recipient of a Fulbright award and in the fall of 2023, she will work with La Maison des Femmes, a Social Justice Center in St. Denis, France. Her current interests include bias and decision making in child abuse evaluations and the use of narrative medicine to mitigate bias.
