

Howard Dubowitz, MD, MS FAAP

Howard Dubowitz is a Professor of Pediatrics and Director of the Center for Families at the University of Maryland School of Medicine in Baltimore. Dr. Dubowitz is a clinician, researcher, and educator, and he is active in the policy arena. His main interests are in child neglect and prevention. Dr. Dubowitz led the development of the Safe Environment for Every Kid (SEEK) model, building upon opportunities in primary care to address social determinants of health and help prevent child abuse and neglect. He edited Neglected Children: Research, Practice and Policy and the International Society for the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect's (ISPCAN) World Perspectives on Child Abuse in 2012, 2014 and 2016, and he co-edited the Handbook for Child Protection Practice and International Aspects of Child Abuse and Neglect. Dr. Dubowitz has over 200 publications and his work has been recognized with national and international awards. He is a Past-President of the Helfer Society, an honorary international group of physicians working in the child maltreatment field. He has served on the Executive Council of ISPCAN and the national boards of the American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children (APSAC) and of Prevent Child Abuse America.
