Rosaura Orengo-Aguayo, PhD (Name Pronunciation | Positionality & Mission Statement)

is an Associate Professor and bilingual (English/Spanish) licensed Clinical Psychologist (SC, #1474; LA, #1604) at the National Crime Victims Research and Treatment Center within the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC). Her research focuses on addressing mental health disparities among underserved populations (specifically Hispanic youth) through innovative implementation and dissemination methods, including telehealth. She also has an active program of research focused on the cultural adaptation and international dissemination of trauma-focused assessment and intervention. She directs the Puerto Rico Outreach Model in Schools- Esperanza (PROMISE), a SAMHSA-funded program aimed bolstering resiliency and promoting psychological recovery among Puerto Rican youth after hurricane Maria. She co-directs a recently funded SAMHSA National Child Traumatic Stress Network Category 2 grant, Telehealth Outreach Program for Traumatic Stress (TOP-TS), aimed at training providers in the delivery of trauma focused services via telehealth in Puerto Rico and underserved areas of the US in collaboration with the National Children Alliance (NCA). She also co-directed a USAID-funded program aimed at creating trauma-informed systems and services for children in El Salvador and has trained mental health providers and foster care staff in trauma-informed practices in Honduras. Dr. Orengo-Aguayo is a Psychological First Aid (PFA) and Skills for Psychological Recovery (SPR) trainer (Spanish and English) and led the Spanish translation of the official SPR manual. She is also an expert in Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT) and has co-trained over 75 psychologists in the Caribbean and Latin America. Dr. Orengo-Aguayo has several seminal publications about the implementation and dissemination of in-person and telehealth delivery of TF-CBT Latin America and US (please see CV). She co-authored the first ever telehealth manual in Spanish published in January of 2022 (please see CV). She is the Social Media Administrator for the International Society for Traumatic Stress Studies (ISTSS) and the 2022 Convention Program Chair for the Association for Behavioral and Cognitive Therapies (ABCT). She co-directs the World Changers Lab at MUSC with Dr. Regan Stewart whose mission is to "change the world, one child at a time."
