Vincent J. Palusci, MD, MS is Professor of Pediatrics at NYU Grossman School of Medicine in New York City. After his pediatric and epidemiology training, he went into private practice and then returned to academic medicine to practice and teach general and child abuse pediatrics. He has developed hospital-based programs to help families develop positive parenting techniques and prevent child maltreatment and has held leadership positions with the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children. Dr. Palusci was a member of the Michigan state child death review team as well as chair of the fatality citizen review panel and local teams. He is currently the editor in chief of the journal Child Maltreatment and board president for Prevent Child Abuse? New York. His research and publications have focused on child abuse fatality, medical practice and prevention, and his latest book is Preventing Child Abuse: Critical Roles and Multiple Perspectives from Nova Science Publishers. He has won awards from the American Academy of Pediatrics, the National Alliance of Children's Trust and Prevention Funds, and the American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children.
