women studying or having recently completed their studies to gain on the job experience. IAWA supports the Fellowship program by providing financial support to these women to make this ICAO connection a reality. We have also partnered with Textron, a company with a global network of aircraft, defense, industrial and finance businesses, for short term internship opportunities. On the mentoring front, we have launched a new program called "Career Connect" where we match women in one-time mentoring situations where the mentee can glean insight from another woman who is in a position to mentor. This approach will be a wonderful way for all members to be mentored by the great women in industry.

Emily, from Plano, Texas, is a junior majoring in Business Management; her minor is Homeland Security. She is an honor roll student and serves as student assistant for Embry-Riddle's Campus Safety and Security Department, captain of the cheer squad and a volunteer tutor.

Summer internships with aviation companies Dallas Airmotive and Signature Flight Support provided opportunities for Emily to complete a variety of data management and analysis and other business management projects and fueled her passion for a career in aviation. She looks forward to working with a large aerospace company after graduation from Embry-Riddle in Fall 2015, possibly in operations management, international business, information technology or safety.

THE WINGS CLUB



The Wings Club, recognized as the premier aviation club in the world, and IAWA (International Aviation Women's Association) honor Robert A. "Bob" Hoover, former Air Show Pilot and United States Air Force Test Pilot, with the fifth annual Outstanding Aviator Award. Created to recognize airmen and airwomen whose actions have made major contributions to aviation and/or security and serve as leadership role models, the presentation of this year's Award has taken place at The Wings Club's Annual Meeting, on the evening of Wednesday, March 26, 2014, at The Yale Club in New York City. Mr. Hoover will accepted the award remotely from his

home in California. Bob Hoover is considered one of the founding fathers of modern aerobatics, having thrilled millions of men, women and children over the past five decades with his acrobatic flying maneuvers. Referred to as "The Pilots' Pilot," Hoover was a fighter pilot during WWII. After flying 58 missions, he was shot down off the coast of southern France and spent sixteen months in a German prison camp. He managed to escape from the prison camp, stole an FW 190 and flew to safety in the Netherlands. After the war, he was the backup pilot in the Bell X-1 program and flew chase for the Lockheed P-80 Shooting Star during the March 1 flight. He's best known, however, for his civil air show career, which started when he was hired to demonstrate the capabilities of Aero Commander's Shrike Commander, a twin piston-engine business aircraft. Hoover has set records for transcontinental and "time to climb" speed and has personally known such great aviators as Orville Wright, Eddie Rickenbacker, Charles Lindbergh, Jimmy Doolittle, Jacqueline Cochran, Neil Armstrong and Yuri Gagarin. During his career, Hoover has been awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, Soldier's Medal for Valor, Air Medal with Clusters, Purple Heart and the French Croix de Guerre. In 1992, he was inducted into the Aerospace Walk of Honor. In 2007, he received the Smithsonian's National Air & Space Museum Trophy. Hoover currently serves as Vice President of Special Projects for Evergreen International Aviation, Inc., and is also a member of the company's Board of Directors.

WRIGHT BROTHERS MEMORIAL AWARD FOR 2013



Congratulations to Marion Blakey, IAWA Advisory Board member, who has been honored as the recipient of the prestigious Wright Brothers Memorial Award for 2013. Marion was presented with the award at the Wright Memorial Dinner hosted by the Aero Club of Washington on Friday, December 13, 2013. IAWA also sponsored the event and many of our Board members attended. The Wright Brothers Memorial Trophy is awarded annually to a living American for "...significant public service of enduring value to aviation in the United States."

Since 2007, Marion Blakey has served as President and Chief Executive Officer of the Aerospace Industries Association, the voice of the aerospace and defense industry. Before that, she served a five-year term as

Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration. As Administrator, Marion regulated the nation's airways as well as operated the world's largest air traffic control system consisting of 44,000 employees and a \$14 billion budget. During her tenure, the traveling public experienced the safest period for air travel in United States' history, and she was a tireless safety advocate, internationally. Under her leadership, FAA launched the Next Generation Air Transportation System - the shift to a satellite-based system that will modernize air transportation, save fuel, and decrease delays. Prior to being named FAA Administrator, Marion served as Chairman of the National Transportation Safety Board, where she improved the Board's accident reporting process and strengthened its advocacy and outreach programs to promote safer travel throughout all modes of transportation. Including her service at the FAA and NTSB, Marion Blakey has held six presidential appointments, four of which required Senate confirmation.

ATTORNEY OF THE YEAR AWARD 2013 GOOD SCOUT AWARD
