

What do OMSSA Committees and Networks do?

The OMSSA Board **creates and dissolves** all OMSSA Committees and Networks. All these groups report to Board as part of the regular Board agenda. Staff may, from time to time, strike ad-hoc working groups to assist them in their work. The results of the latter flow back to the Board via staff reports and recommendations. The current OMSSA Committees include:

Executive Committee

Made up of OMSSA's senior Board executives.

Education Committee

Assists with the strategic direction of OMSSA's training and workshop offerings.

Awards Committee

Steers the nomination process and makes recommendations to the Board on who should receive OMSSA's Awards.

Policy Advisory Committee

Provides input into policy positions the Association should take appropriately.

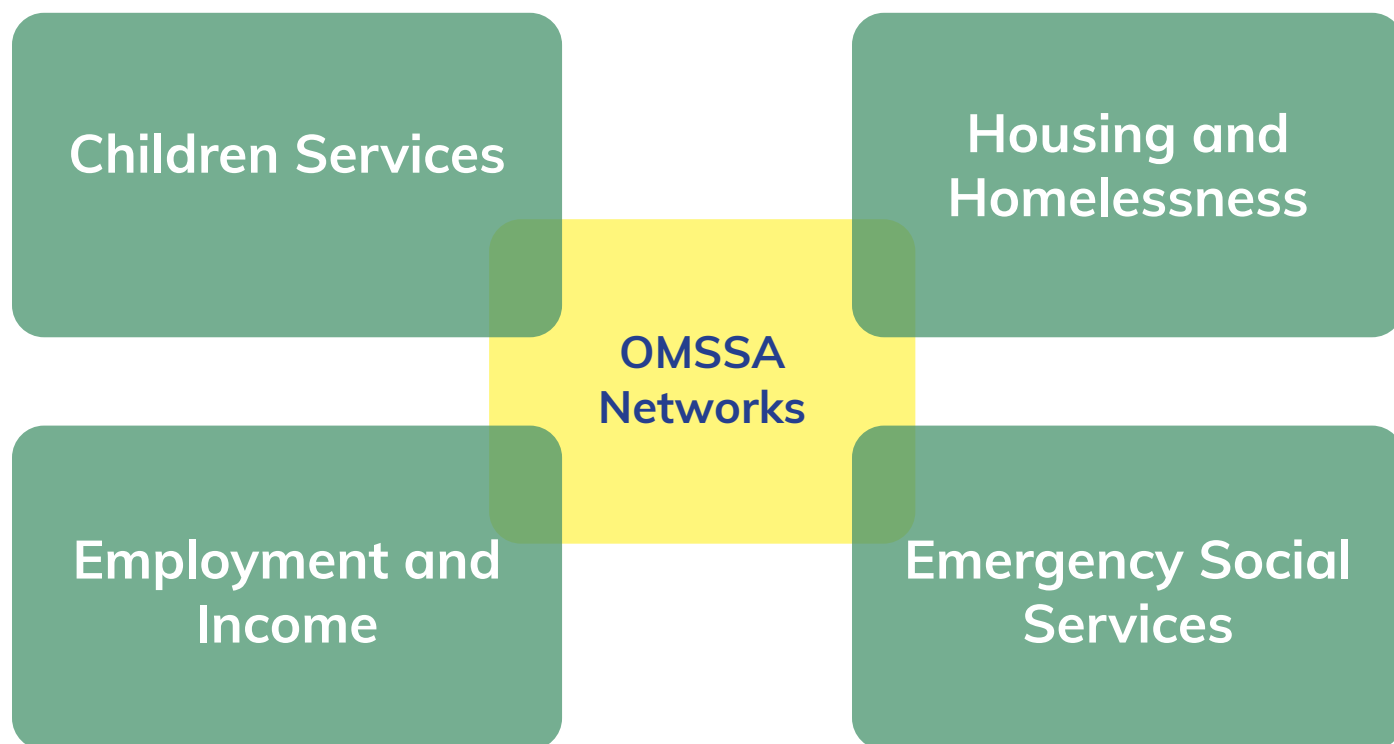
Governance & Accountability

Advises the Board on by-laws, and operational policies and procedure.

Finance Committee

Provides oversight to the association's financial processes and reporting.

- ▶ Support the **development of OMSSA education events** such as conferences and forums.
- ▶ Support advocacy by **providing information to OMSSA on the local realities** for members and their communities, capacities, and initiatives.
