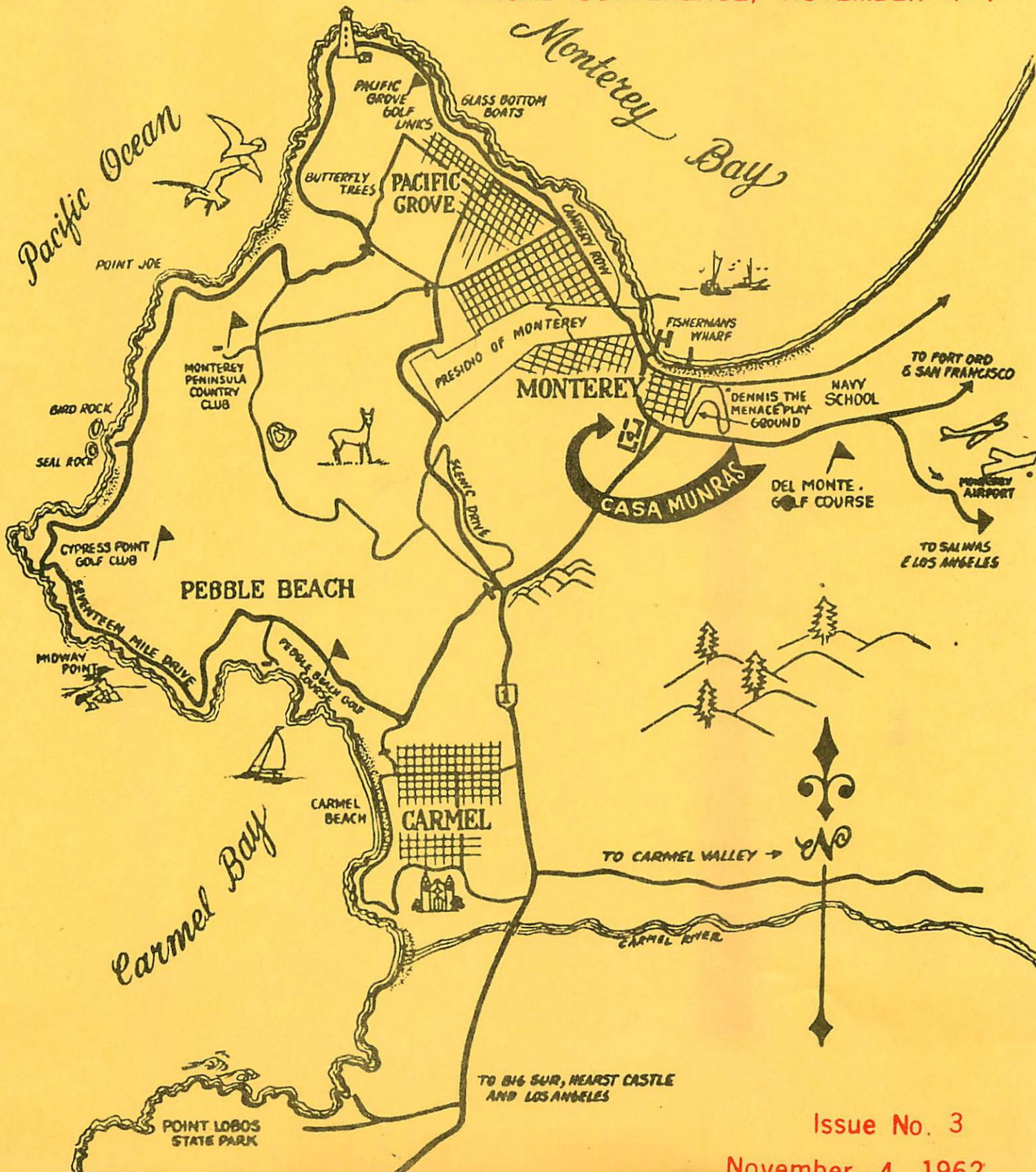

OFFICIAL CONFERENCE PROGRAM RELEASED TODAY

Copies of the official program for the 1962 PCACRAO Conference are now available at the registration desk in the main lobby of the Casa Munras. This program contains details on all general and section meetings and lists PCACRAO Officers and Conference Committee members.

Several additions and changes to the Conference program as it was published in the last issue of "Conference News" have been announced. The following topics and speakers have been selected by Wayne S. Johnson, Chairman of the Junior College Section Meeting, which will be held from 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. on Tuesday, November 6th:

Political and Social Implications of the Junior College - Dr. Henry F. Tyler, Executive Secretary, California Junior College Association.

Population Trends and Finances - Mr. Roy Bell, Assistant Director, Department of Finance, California.

The Junior College as a Partner in Higher Education - Dr. Jerald Cresci, Bureau of Junior College Education, California.

Dr. Robert E. McConnell, Regional Representative, U. S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare, has been chosen as the speaker for the luncheon to be held at the Del Monte Lodge on Tuesday, November 6th. His topic will be "No College is an Island unto Itself." Dr. McConnell is a graduate of Montana State College and holds a Master's degree from the University of Wisconsin and a Phd from the State University of Iowa. He has had experience as a teacher in high school and college and as a college administrator. Before coming to the U. S. Office to Education, he was president of Central Washington State College, Ellensburg. He has written widely for educational periodicals, is former president of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education, and has served a two year term in the National Commission on Accrediting and a two year term on the Executive Committee of the Association of Higher Education. Tickets for this luncheon which is part of a tour of the 17 Mile Drive are available at the Conference Registration Desk.

Hobart Lovett, Chairman of the Displays and Exhibits Committee has announced that the following firms will have commercial exhibits at the Casa Munras:

"The Avery Label Company will exhibit pressure-sensitive Tabulables, made by typewriter or IBM tabulator, and applied by means of an electric dispenser, - a speedy and economical device to expedite mass mailings and repeat mailings, and for grade and test score postings. Correction tape will also be shown which is designed to facilitate making fluid duplicator corrections.

Western Microfilm, Inc., will show how student records can be copied in your own office, then reproduced quickly and cheaply on paper or card stock by continuous, high speed electrostatic equipment."

"The T. A. McChristy Company will demonstrate the Auto-typist, a fast, automatic unit which selects and types precomposed letters or paragraphs that have been perforated on a wide paper roll. Auto-typist prepares answers to inquiries, notices to students and faculty, quickly and cheaply, and with the personal touch lacking in "form" letters."

Mr. Lovett urges conferees not to wait until the last day of the Conference to investigate these exhibits so that the exhibitors will be able to give each visitor the attention he deserves.

"FIRST THEATER OPENING IS FUN FOR FULL HOUSE --- A western melodrama of the 1870's, "The Hand of the Law: or Justice Will Prevail," in three amply eventful acts, opened before a full house last night in California's First Theater.

There should be no problem in filling the house each Friday and Saturday night during the scheduled run of this production through Dec. 1. Not only is "The Hand of the Law" a highly entertaining vintage tale involving villains and their prospective victims, star-crossed lovers and bucolic buffoonery, but its accompanying Olio has originality of format and a fresh, new sparkle.

While a few opening-night lapses of pace could be noted here and there, and occasional bits of dialogue and characterizations need to be sharpened, these defects were offset by some exceptionally good performances."
