More News about People, Bricks, and Things

Dr. J. Evan Armstrong, President and Founder (in 1918) of Armstrong College, and Mrs. Esther Armstrong, Director of the Placement Bureau at Armstrong College, are retiring next spring after combined service of 71 years at the college! The Armstrongs have attended our meetings regularly, and plan to come to Long Beach. Dr. Armstrong celebrated his 75th birthday last May. He and Mrs. Armstrong merit the pleasure and freedom of the emeritus status. Our best wishes to them.

Mary Ashley reports that the Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena was accredited in full by the American Association of Theological Schools last December.

Among the distinguished former students of St. Olaf College, Northfield, Minnesota, is Clarence R. Bergland, Associate Dean--Admissions and Records, Long Beach State College. St. Olaf is also famous for its world-traveling choir.

The Rev. Geoffrey G. Bridges has been appointed Registrar at San Luis Rey College, replacing Rev. Seraphin Muller.

Wallin J. Carlson's title at Chico State College has been changed from Registrar to Associate Dean--Admissions and Records. Congratulations, Wallin. The new Registrar is Robert O. Bess, who received his master's degree last summer in Counseling and Guidance at Columbia University.

Sister M. Agnes Cecile, Registrar at the College of the Holy Names in Oakland, reports that the new campus of the college was dedicated on October 26.

F. Philler Curtis, Director of Admissions and Registrar, Menlo College, reports that the college has opened two new buildings this fall, a dormitory for 100 men, and a Student Memorial Center. These buildings replace a dormitory and a Student Union razed last summer.

James English tells us that the Los Angeles College of Optometry has received a federal grant of \$82,000 for a new residence hall to be build this fall.

Ruth Newman of Palomar College can report architectural details on something different at Palomar College--a new circular dome-shaped Physical Education Building. This was the first design approved in California by the State Division of Architecture, Department of School Planning, for use of the Kaiser aluminum geodesic "stressed skin" construction.

Emery E. Owens of Chapman College is happy that they are breaking ground this fall for two new dormitories that will cost about one million iron men. Chapman moved to Orange a few years ago, and is very happy with the new location.

Merle Quait reports that last month the name of the Oakland Junior College was officially changed to Oakland City College. This college is only four years old, but is already second largest junior college in Northern California.

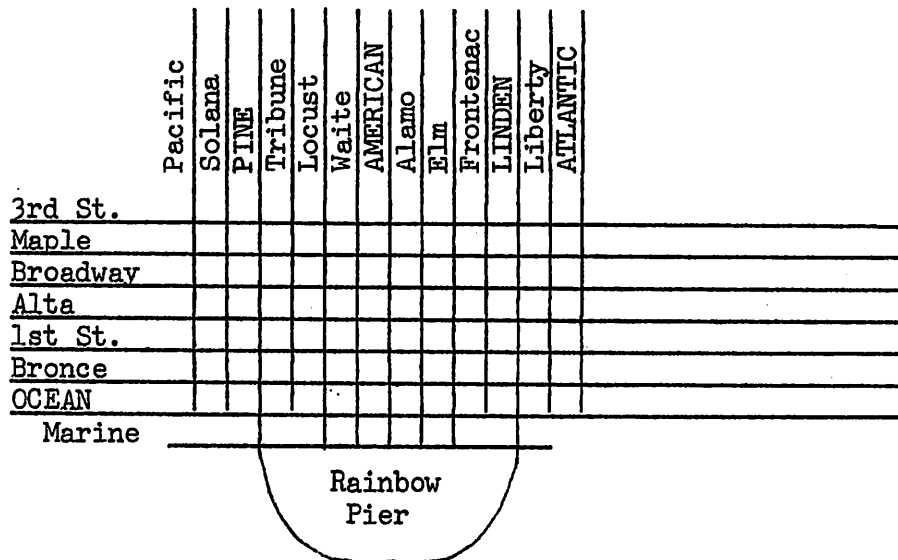
