PACRAO FELLOWSHIPS AVAILABLE

Interested PACRAO members may now apply for a PACRAO Fellowship. The program provides PACRAO members an opportunity to enhance their skills and knowledge and to prepare for future leadership positions. The fellowship gives members opportunities to attend graduate school part or full time in an area of study related to the admissions and records field, to attend summer institutes related to the profession, or to underwrite research projects related to the admissions and records field.

To be considered for a PACRAO Fellowship, not to exceed \$1,000 in any budget year, the candidate must satisfy the following:

- * Have spent a minimum of 2 years in the profession.
- * Be from a current dues-paying PACRAO institution member.
- * Submit a PACRAO Fellowship application to the PACRAO Vice President, Four-year Institutions.
- * Attach a statement of purpose.
- * Meet application deadline of May 15 for receipt of materials for the following 1989/90 year.
