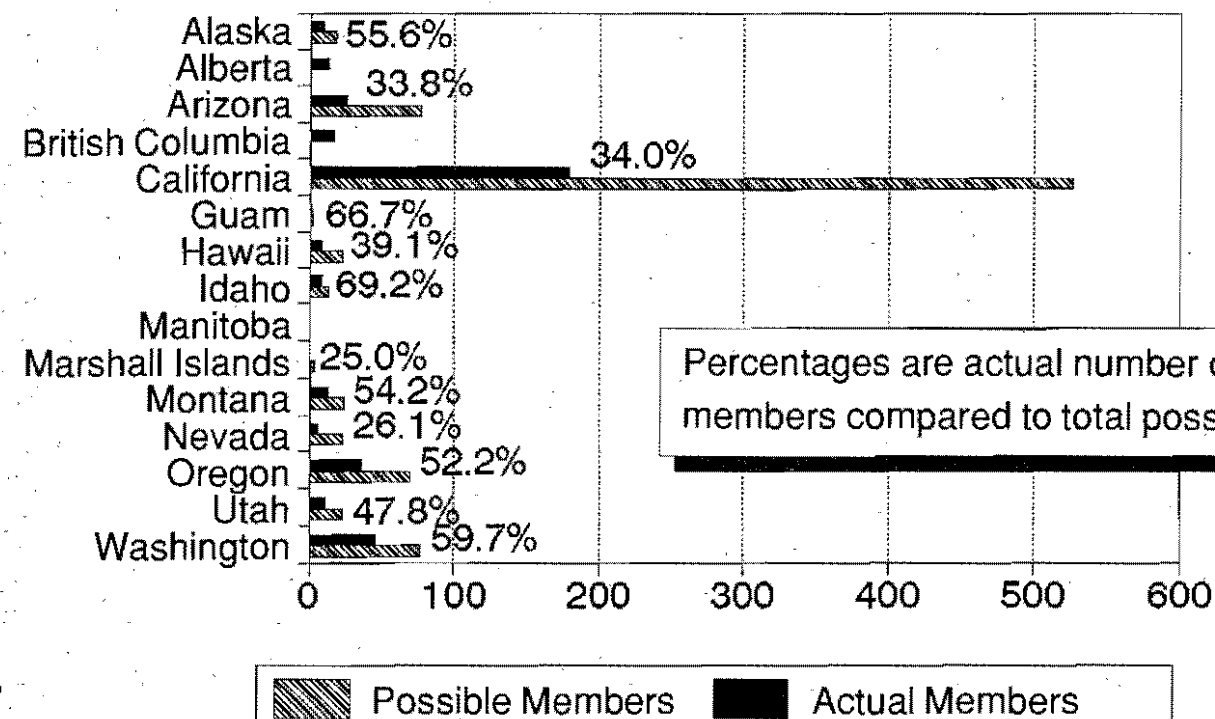

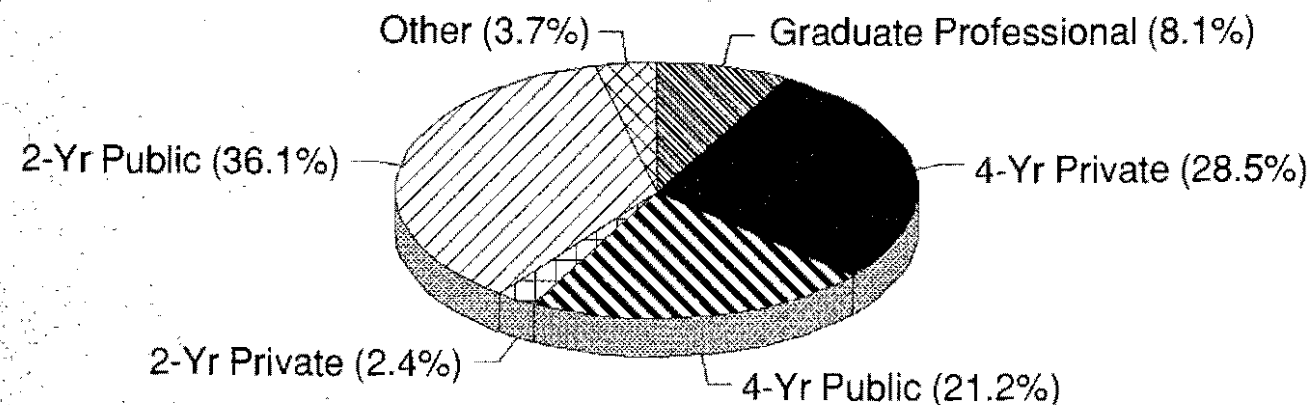
## Membership by Province/State
