Not that 50's Music Again!

In a recent conversation with a colleague, we were talking about ways to encourage more PACRAO members to participate in PACRAO and AACRAO leadership. When we discussed the average age of the current PACRAO leadership (only an estimate of course), my colleague's comment was, "Well, just look at the music we've been playing at our special events for the past ten years!" Indeed, our music seems to be stuck in the 50s. I tried to comfort myself that it is because that music has a good beat, it's pretty easy to have fun with, and who can dance to 80s music anyway? But the truth is, it's crucial for any organization to actively encourage newer members to participate, because new leadership will bring fresh ideas (and fresh music) to energize and challenge an association. It is up to the current leadership to actively recruit and serve as mentors to new leaders, to leave a strong organization as a legacy, and to know when to get out of their way.

The board met in late June and finalized the new job descriptions of the board, discussed ways to make the transition from the current board to next year's board as effective as possible, and explored how PACRAO can continue to reach out to its members. We have agreed that in this age of technological advancements, we will rely more heavily on the web for maintaining our history and conveying information to the membership. We agreed to phase out a little used PACRAO brochure in favor of improving and updating our web site. The web site development has not proceeded as quickly as we anticipated, but it is moving along. We plan to move away from a lengthy Conference Proceedings on the web, and rely more on the program descriptions and the final roster of presenters. We want to make sure the information we provide is both timely and useful, and that we don't waste volunteers' time producing documents that are not useful to the membership. The board reviewed the latest version of the proposed PACRAO logo from our designer, and

agreed that it needed to reflect more of the PACRAO tradition. If this final phase of logo review goes well, a new logo will be presented to the membership for their approval in November. PACRAO is looking forward.



The board carefully reviewed the budget to date, particularly in light of the expenditures we had agreed to support in our January meeting. Because PACRAO's budget has been strong and continues to grow, we had agreed to spend slightly more than our revenues this year *if* those expenditures reflected improved service to the members. In June we were able to factor in the final (and generous) return from the Portland conference. With that information, we reduced the amount of our projected expenditures, and we brought the budget to a fiscally sound balance of maintaining the

organization, improving our services to members, and keeping a healthy amount in reserves.

Fall is upon us – a time that is both energizing and exhausting. It reminds us that we are in this “business” of higher education to ensure that our students have the best possible opportunities to learn, to develop, and to contribute to this world in which we live. May we remember to be inspired by this mission, to celebrate the accomplishments of our learning communities and to make time to enjoy the fruits of our own labors.

PACRAO Membership Recognition

Many of you will soon be making travel arrangements to this year's annual conference. One of the most enjoyable activities is when the Association recognizes and honors its members. The Awards Committee will be looking at three types of recognition for the annual conference. These include Retirement Certificates, Honorary Membership, and the Distinguished Service Award.

Members of the Association who have retired since last November 1999 or will retire before the annual meeting in La Jolla in November 2000 are recognized with a **Retirement Certificate**. If you are aware of an individual within your office or institution that meets these criteria please notify me of their name and institution so that they can receive the acknowledgment they deserve.

The **Honorary Membership** recipients are selected by the Awards Committee but may be nominated by any member of PACRAO. Honorary Membership may be granted to an individual upon their retirement from the profession or when they leave the profession to follow another career path. Members who have performed dedicated service to the Association through an office or through significant participation and service to PACRAO are eligible for

consideration.

The **Distinguished Service Award** is reserved for those members who have demonstrated truly exceptional leadership and notable service to the Association and to the profession. This recognition may be awarded at the end of a member's career or for significant contribution on a special project or effort on behalf of the Association.

Both the Distinguished Service Award and the Honorary Membership are not necessarily awarded annually. If any member of the Association is aware of someone who is deserving of either of these awards please forward their name along with a short written statement that supports their candidacy. 



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
